This past year, Neighborhood Healthcare has continued to provide a high level of quality of care to its 66,000 patients in two counties in 14 locations. We have mirrored our work around the quadruple aim framework, which looks to improve the health of the population, enhance the patient experience, improve the clinician experience, while reducing costs.

- We have always been a leader in providing comprehensive diabetes care. We were early adopters of the Project Dulce model, utilizing nurses who are certified diabetic educators to provide robust diabetes care. We expanded the model to include retinal photography to detect diabetic eye disease, and this year have added podiatry services with the goal of preventing amputations.
- We have been actively seeking collaborative partners in the community to better leverage the services we all provide. We have deepened our partnership with Interfaith, giving us a greater ability to help our patients with their unmet social needs.
- Receiving health care at Neighborhood Healthcare is much more than primary, dental and mental health care. These services are a given, but truly our goal is to help move our patients from sickness to wellness, from having unmet social needs to being on equal footing. GOLD FAMILY HEALTHCARE CENTER OPENS IN POWAY



Since April 2018

- **1,800** patients have been seen at Poway totalling 4,449 visits.
- **722** of these visits were Behavioral Health visits with youth 18-years-old or younger
- Every patient is screened for **10 social determinants** of health
- **Many of our patients are monolingual.** They speak English, Spanish, Russian, Arabic, Bangla and Tagalog.

IMPROVING ACCESS TO SPECIALTY CARE FOR PATIENTS

Making a Difference

Community health centers like Neighborhood Healthcare comprise the US's core health-safety net and provide primary care to anyone who walks through their doors. However, access to specialty care for community health center patients has been a big challenge due to funding and long waiting lists at local specialty centers.

These services are critical for continued and consistent recovery or health maintenance and it has been Neighborhood Healthcare's priority to provide affordable specialty services at the same location where a patient sees their doctor.

Last year, Neighborhood Healthcare succeeded in bringing affordable specialty care—chiropractic care, acupuncture and podiatry—to thousands of patients at its 14 health centers.

Having a podiatrist provide patients with education about the importance of avoiding any infection that could lead to an amputation is making a big impact with diabetic patients. For those patients suffering from chronic pain, chiropractic care and acupuncture can often provide desired relief with little to no cost to patients.

In addition to better healthcare outcomes, community health center patients are no longer seeking out Emergency Centers for back pain, migraines or wound care. Both the patient and entire community benefits when there is easy and affordable access to specialty care.



Primary care services we offer have been our main focus for decades. This care has enabled us to provide convenient, high quality, and technologically advanced medicine. Today with specialty care services, we are able to better assist our patients dealing with pain or complications from diabetes.

HELPING NEW IMMIGRANTS SUCCEED

Gabriela's Story

Gabriela* had just relocated to the United States with her 5-year-old-son, Danny, when she received an enrollment packet from her son's elementary school.

She does not speak English and found that enrolling her son into public school required many steps and healthcare exams.

She was overwhelmed, afraid, and concerned about not meeting the school's enrollment deadline, since neither she nor her son were covered by health insurance nor could she afford medical and dental visits.

The elementary school counselor referred Gabriela to Neighborhood Healthcare (NHcare). When she was told that her son had cavities, she was afraid that school officials would not let her son attend school.

With the assistance of Neighborhood Healthcare's Certified Enrollment Counselor, Gabriela was able to get the medical and dental care she needed for her son and enroll her son in school before the deadline.

"Thank you so much for helping me and my son. I am grateful he is in school and learning," she said.

Neighborhood Healthcare (NHcare) has a robust Behavioral Health Department providing a wide range of services that are now available to Interfaith clients.

The two agencies formed an alliance this past year deepening their existing partnership to combine unique resources that support some of the most vulnerable clients and patients with complex needs.

This formal partnership is streamlining care for Neighborhood Healthcare patients by connecting them to Interfaith’s continuum of substance abuse services including detox, residential housing, transportation, employment, senior services and more.

Neighborhood Healthcare offers Interfaith clients medical, dental and behavioral healthcare services and collaborates coordination of care. Some of this work has been grant funded thanks to the Escondido Charitable Foundation, however, future funding is needed to continue this partnership.

SAVING LIVES

INCREASING TIMELY CANCER SCREENING FOR HISPANIC PATIENTS: UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, SAN DIEGO (UCSD)

Neighborhood Healthcare partnered with UCSD this past year through the “Colorectal Screening Strategies for Community Health Centers” research grant that was funded by the American Cancer Society Research Scholar program.

Colorectal Cancer (CRC) is the second leading cause of cancer death in the United States, but convincing evidence shows that CRC screening can reduce CRC incidence and mortality.

Compared to non-Hispanic Whites, Hispanics are more likely to be diagnosed at advanced stages, and less likely to survive CRC.

Uninsured Hispanics have the lowest screening rates of any group (11%).

Through this joint effort, Neighborhood Healthcare is reaching out to all its patients and focusing on Hispanic patients who may not understand the value of screening and scheduling a life-saving appointment.

ADVANCING PRECISION MEDICINE

THE NATIONAL INSTITUTES OF HEALTH

Neighborhood Healthcare was one of 46 health centers in the nation to receive funding to partner with the National Institutes of Health for a precision medicine program.

Precision medicine is a revolutionary approach for disease prevention and treatment that takes into account individual differences in lifestyle, environment, and biology. The National Institutes of Health has launched the All of Us Research Program with the mission to accelerate health research and medical breakthroughs, enabling individualized prevention, treatment, and care for all of us. The goal is to enroll 1 million people from different backgrounds, races, ethnicities, ages, etc.

With new technology, researchers are beginning to look at how to develop treatments that are more precise based on the individual.

This year, Neighborhood Healthcare will begin educating and helping to enroll interested patients and community members in this important research.

PROVIDING DENTAL CARE FOR STUDENTS AT SCHOOL DURING SCHOOL HOURS

FIRST 5 RIVERSIDE PROVIDES FUNDING

Neighborhood Healthcare opened its Hemet health center almost 3 years ago and the agency has found that its pediatric patients get needed medical care but very often children don't see a dentist at our Hemet Dental Center.

Thanks to First 5 Riverside's funding, children now have a convenient place to get a dental check up. At school!

Neighborhood Healthcare's school dental clinics are a community-based health delivery system that provides risk-based preventive and early intervention therapeutic services. When complex dental treatment is necessary, the Neighborhood Healthcare dental team connects patients to a dental center or refers them to their existing dental home.

Now many students are hoping to join the No Cavity Club at school! Thank you First 5 Riverside.

SENIOR PEER PROGRAM

Neighborhood Healthcare created its Senior Peer Program to provide social support and to connect Latino seniors. This program reduces the isolation of older adults within the community by creating meaningful connections with their neighbors. More than 52 seniors now spend Fridays together. Some have been coming to the program more than 13 years and wouldn't think about missing special time with friends and learning more about various healthcare topics.

WHAT DO I WANT TO DO WHEN I GROW UP?

It's a question that every boy and girl asks themselves: What do I want to do when I grow up?

To help high school students answer that question, Neighborhood Healthcare and Escondido COMPACT have partnered together for 12 years organizing an annual Job Shadow Day.

By participating in Job Shadow Day, Escondido High School students ages 16-18 are able to explore their future career goals in a real world setting.

These students shadow Neighborhood Healthcare doctors, podiatrists, physician assistants, medical assistants, dentists and dental assistants to experience day-to-day tasks.

This program has inspired the lives of 180 local teens. One student said she wanted be a midwife and deliver babies while another student said it helped him decide that medicine is not for him.

WHAT'S HAPPENING AT THE GOLD FAMILY HEALTH CENTER

Pediatric Behavioral Health Services

The pediatric behavioral health services we offer at Poway (and at most of our 14 locations) are for children and adolescents of all ages and ethnic backgrounds. I have seen two children in particular who witnessed their father being taken by a drug cartel in Northern Mexico and they are suffering with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD). Also, some of the Iraqi children we see are being treated for PTSD as well.

Our staff is bicultural and/or bilingual, fully trained, licensed, board certified, and local to national experts in the field of children's mental health.

We treat mild to severe mental illnesses including but not limited to depression, mood disorders, psychosis, anxiety, behavioral issues related to autism, and academic difficulties related to mental illnesses. 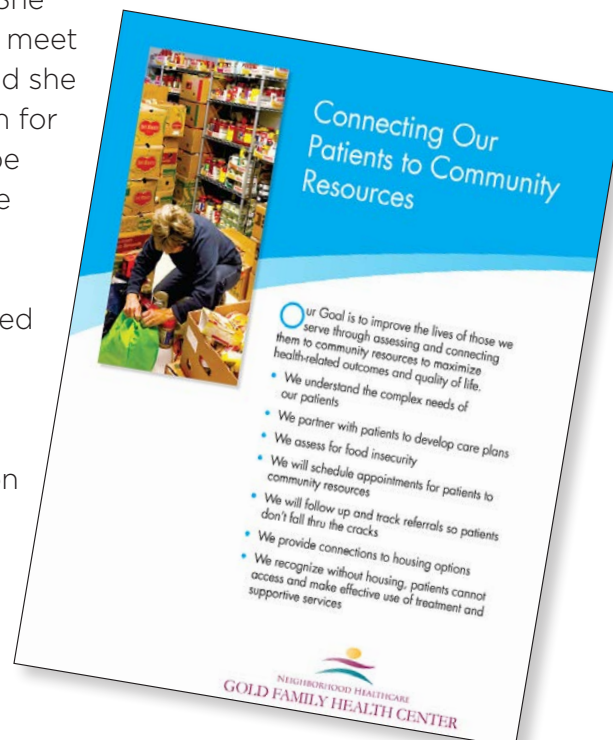

BEYOND A MEDICAL APPOINTMENT: MEETING UNMET SOCIAL NEEDS

"I'm the Complex Care Resource Specialist at the Gold Family Health Center. My job is to meet with every patient, have a conversation with them and screen for unmet social needs. Recently after meeting with a Poway patient, he said, 'I am so happy I came in here. I didn't know you existed. Not only did I get to see a doctor but I got help looking for a job.'"

Since April, we're finding that our patients who have CalFresh run out of food before the end of the month so we connect them with a local food pantry or give them a \$25 gift card to a grocery store. We are grateful for these cards generously supplied by Friends and Families Community Connection located in Poway.

One patient I've recently been helping is a victim of domestic abuse. She only speaks Russian but we have wonderful translators. She takes every step we offer her and she is making progress in leaving a dangerous situation. We were able to provide her with a free cell phone since her phone at home is constantly monitored. She comes to our center to meet Legal Aid (it's safer) and she has enrolled in CalFresh for groceries. She should be approved for affordable housing for herself and two children in a few weeks and she is enrolled in education courses at the Employment Development Department so she is on the way to becoming self-sufficient.
